



Care and Maintenance of Your Zebra Puzzle Mats

For optimal performance and longevity, it is important to clean your Zebra puzzle mats properly. Improper cleaning can void your product warranty. Please read through all of these instructions regarding the cleaning of your Zebra puzzle mats. - Use mild soap only when cleaning your mats.
- Do not use bleach on your mats.
- Zebra puzzle mats are water resistant, but they should not be saturated with water. The water can seep through the cracks and settle beneath the mats which may cause mold or mildew issues.
- If your Zebra puzzle mats become saturated with water, lift them up, take them apart, and allow them to fully dry before reinstalling them.
- We recommend disinfecting your mats at the end of every day with Zebra Enviro-Care Neutral Disinfectant cleaner. Cleaning between uses may be needed depending on the mat traffic and bodily contact with the mats.

Daily Cleaning Instructions

1. Remove loose debris from surface of mats using a broom, shop-vac, vacuum cleaner with no “beater bar,” or vacuum cleaner set to “hard floor setting.” The “beater-bar” agitates and repeatedly brushes the mat which can damage the vinyl.
2. Mix the cleaning solution by adding 2 ounces of Zebra Enviro-care concentrate per gallon of water.
3. Apply the diluted solution to the mats with a cloth, mop, sponge, or spray bottle. Do not saturate the surface of the mats.
4. Let the solution air dry on the surface for a minimum of 10 minutes to kill or inactivate viruses. No rinsing is necessary. Allow mats to dry completely before use.

Special Decontamination Cleaning Instructions

1. To clean blood or other bodily fluids from your mats, always follow universal precautions and use barrier protection (disposable gloves, protective clothing, face mask, and safety glasses) to prevent skin and mucous membrane contact with blood or other bodily fluids. All infectious materials must be disposed of according to federal, state, and local regulations for infectious waste disposal.
2. After blood or other bodily fluids are thoroughly cleaned from surfaces, follow the daily disinfecting cleaning instructions above.
